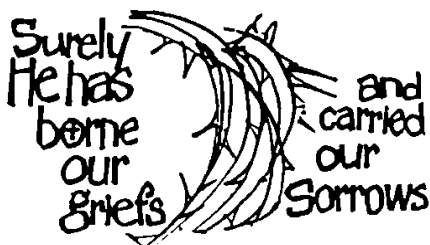

CLOSING RALLY - 40 DAYS FOR LIFE: The closing rally for this campaign of 40 Days for Life is Palm Sunday (today), the 24th of March, 2:00 p.m. at 2401 East Stroop Rd. Father Martin Fox of St. Rose Parish in Cincinnati will be the guest speaker. All are invited. An update of the babies (and parents) saved will soon be announced. A big thank you for all the Saint Luke prayer warriors who have prayed for this campaign.

VESPERS: Each Sunday through Palm Sunday, we will be praying Evening Prayer at 6:30 p.m. in St. Dominic's Chapel. Evening prayer is part of the Liturgy of the Hours, the official prayer of the Church. It provides a wonderful addition to your Lenten observance. Please come join us.

REGULATION ON LENTEN FASTING & ABSTINENCE: The Church assigns two public acts of penance during Lent – (1) fasting from food; and (2) abstinence from meat. Both penances are assigned on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting from food - meals for a day equal to no more than one full meal is traditionally assigned to everyone between 18 and 59 years of age. Abstaining from meat - Fridays of Lent are traditionally assigned to everyone over 14 years of age. A Catholic is obligated to participate in these public penitential days. The Holy Father has taught that a person's failure to observe an individual day of public penance is not to be considered serious. A person's failure to observe a substantial number of penitential days, however, is to be considered serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard. Instead, people should consider doing more individual, private acts of penance instead of the minimal days of public acts of penance.

NO LENTEN BAPTISMS: In the ancient tradition of the Church, the season of Lent is a special period for penance, prayer and fasting to: a) prepare the unbaptized for baptism and b) deepen the conversion and renewal of those who are baptized. In keeping with the Lenten spirit, Saint Luke will not celebrate baptisms between Ash Wednesday and Easter. Naturally, circumstance, such as the welfare of the child, health of the mother or other serious pastoral reason, may dictate an exception.

BAPTISMAL FONT EMPTIED DURING LENT: The stark dryness of the font during the 40 days of Lent invites parishioner reflection on the gift of eternal life and victory over sin that is ours in waters of baptism. More mundanely, the draining and surface drying allow for an inspection, cleaning, repair and prevention efforts in the pool, over-flow basin, filters and pumps, and for stone / marble discoloring and resealing work.

NURSERY CLOSED: The nursery will be closed Holy Saturday (March 30) and Easter Sunday (March 31), and will reopen the following weekend Saturday (April 6) and Sunday (April 7).

CHURCH HANDICAP-ONLY ENTRANCE: The emergency exit near the handicap parking spaces on the school-side of the parking lot is now a handicap-only entrance. An outside entrance-panel is activated and available **30 minutes** before all weekend Masses begin, and deactivates **5 minutes** before Mass is scheduled to start. For example, if you attend the 10:00 a.m. Mass, the door will open starting at 9:30 a.m. and lock at 9:55 a.m. The inside exit-panel is active at all times. Able parishioners are not to use the handicap-only entrance as an alternative door.
