We are available Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. You can also find registration forms on our parish website at www.saintlukeparish.org. Place them in the offering basket or return to the church office.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING: We will conduct a training session for those desiring to become Lay Eucharistic Ministers. This is a wonderful way to support the parish. The training session will be held on Wednesday May 15, at 6:30 p.m. in the main church. Requirements for becoming a Lay Eucharistic minister include: a fully initiated Catholic (i.e. Baptized, Confirmed, and having received First Communion), actively practicing the Catholic faith, a desire to serve God by serving others, and a commitment to the ministry program. ST LUKE PARISH BOOK OF PRAYER: The St. Luke Parish Book of Prayer is located in the church under the Saint Luke icon. It has blank pages for every day of the year. COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND: If you know of a parishioner who is homebound or living in an assisted care facility and would like to receive Holy Communion on a recurring basis, please contact the Jansen Center at 426-1733 x 301.

CHURCH HANDICAP-ONLY ENTRANCE: The emergency exit near the handicap parking spaces on the school-side of the parking lot is a handicap-only entrance. An outside entrance-panel is activated and available **30 minutes** before all weekend Masses begin, and deactivates **5 minutes** before Mass is scheduled to start. For example, if you attend the 10:00 a.m. Mass, the door will open starting at 9:30 a.m. and lock at 9:55 a.m. The inside exit-panel is active at all times. Able parishioners are not to use the "handicap-only" entrance as an alternative door.

HELP FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED: Do you have a tough time hearing during Mass? Help is here! We have four hearing assistance devices available that are very simple to use. Put an ear bud in one of your ears and you will be hearing the priest, choir, and lectors more clearly. Speak with one of the ushers prior to the beginning of Mass to check out one of these units.

PARKING LOT REMINDERS: Parishioners are reminded that parking spaces on the circular North Fairfield Road driveway on weekends and holy days are for elderly and handicapped individuals who experience distance as a real obstacle to coming to church. For safety reasons, there is no parking along the access road from Fairfield Road to the Bishop Ford Hall, this is a fire lane. Your assistance is appreciated.

CHURCH BUILDING CLOSING TIME DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS: Church doors will be routinely locked around 7:00 p.m. for the summer. Parishioners wishing to pray or schedule meetings after 7:00 p.m. should call the parish office to arrange for the doors to remain open. If a conflict arises with a locked door, parishioners can go to the Jansen Center during business hours for assistance.

JESUS AND WE - A COMMUNITY LECTIO DIVINA: Presented by Gail Lyman, **Immaculate Conception Parish** (2300 South Smithville Road, Dayton, 45420) Wednesday, **May 15th**, 7-8:30 p.m., in **M. Sherman Hall**. Our study of the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians has clearly impressed upon us the importance Paul placed on the community role. Paul struggled to communicate to his audience that Christianity is not about "Jesus and Me" but rather "Jesus and We." In this session our emphasis will be on the community reading of this epistle. Taking the ancient Catholic practice of Lectio Divina (Divine Reading) the participants will be introduced to reading the scriptures as a community of faith. As Jesus said, "Where two or three are gathered..." (Mt 18:20). Almost always, such an exercise brings the participants a deep love for scripture and a genuine engagement with the faith community. All are welcome to attend.
