We are available Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. You can also find registration forms on our parish website at www.saintlukeparish.org. Place them in the offering basket or return to the church office.

VOLUNTEER TO BE AN USHER: God calls each of us to a specific mission in this life. Many times we receive more than one invitation to serve God by serving others. We have an opportunity for parishioners to do just that! We are still in need of ushers to assist at Mass. Specifically, we have the greatest need at the 5:30 p.m. Mass on Saturday, the 8 a.m. and 12 p.m. Masses on Sunday. Volunteering is easy, speak with one of the ushers you meet at Mass or call Jansen Center at (937) 426-1733 x 301. There is no formal training, simply “on the job.” Ushers can be male or female, young or old. Please consider volunteering. Your help will be greatly appreciated.

ST LUKE PARISH BOOK OF PRAYER: The St. Luke Parish Book of Prayer is located in the church under the Saint Luke icon. It has blank pages for every day of the year. Parishioners are invited to write their special prayers of petition in this book. We remember all of these written intentions in our general intercessions at weekend Masses.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND: If you know of a parishioner who is homebound or living in an assisted care facility who would like to receive Holy Communion on a recurring basis, please contact the Jansen Center at 426-1733 x 301.

CHURCH HANDICAP-ONLY ENTRANCE: The emergency exit near the handicap parking spaces on the school-side of the parking lot is a handicap-only entrance. An outside entrance-panel is activated and available **30 minutes** before all weekend Masses begin, and deactivates **5 minutes** before Mass is scheduled to start. For example, if you attend the 10:00 a.m. Mass, the door will open starting at 9:30 a.m. and lock at 9:55 a.m. The inside exit-panel is active at all times. Able parishioners are not to use the “handicap-only” entrance as an alternative door.

HELP FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED: Do you have a tough time hearing during Mass? Help is here! We have four hearing assistance devices available that are very simple to use. Put an ear bud in one of your ears and you will be hearing the priest, choir, and lectors more clearly. Speak with one of the ushers prior to the beginning of Mass to check out one of these units.

PARKING LOT REMINDERS: Parishioners are reminded that parking spaces on the circular North Fairfield Road driveway on weekends and holy days are for elderly and handicapped individuals who experience distance as a real obstacle to coming to church. For safety reasons, there is no parking along the access road from Fairfield Road to the Bishop Ford Hall, this is a fire lane. Your assistance is appreciated.

CHURCH BUILDING CLOSING TIME DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS: Church doors will be routinely locked around 7:00 p.m. for the summer. Parishioners wishing to pray or schedule meetings after 7:00 p.m. should call the parish office to arrange for the doors to remain open. If a conflict arises with a locked door, parishioners can go to the Jansen Center during business hours for assistance.

+ **Pope Francis on Suffering** In his May 7 homily, the Pope described the Christian response to suffering as "silence in endurance, silence in patience." During his Passion, the Pope noted, Jesus "did not speak much, only two or three necessary words ... But it is not a sad silence: the silence of bearing the Cross is not a sad silence. It is painful, often very painful, but it is not sad. The heart is at peace." The Pope further explained suffering as "bearing, carrying the weight of difficulties, the weight of contradictions, the weight of tribulations on our shoulders. This Christian attitude of bearing up, of being patient....This is a process of Christian maturity...a process that takes some time...and evolves over a lifetime, arriving at Christian maturity. It is like a good wine.

+ **Twitter and Pope Francis** The @Pontifex Twitter account is being used as a tool of the New Evangelization adapting to new forms of communicating not just with the faithful, but with all people. The number of tweets sent by Pope Francis have been steadily increasing, going to almost one tweet a day. With such messages as, "Dear young people, do not bury your talents, the gifts that God has given you! Do not be afraid to dream of great things!" The Holy Father sends small, but concrete messages that touch at the hopes and desires of all despite its 140 character limit.

+ **The Search Institute** This is an organization whose mission is to "provide catalytic leadership, breakthrough knowledge, and innovative resources to advance the health of children, youth, families, and communities." 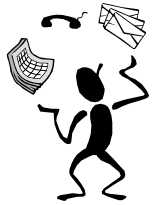
