GOOD SHEPHERD MINISTRIES NEEDS WORKERS: Good Shepherd Ministries, a Christian agency restoring people in recovery and reentry, is looking for volunteers to assist with the renovation of our newly purchased downtown Dayton building at 1115 E. 3rd St., near Keowee. We are racing hard to open a Thrift Store at this location before Christmas and we desperately need your help! Skilled or unskilled individuals or groups are welcome. Skilled tasks can change as we finish areas; we are currently hanging drywall, plastering, taping, painting, making an A/C wood deck, installing a drop ceiling, laying 1300 sq. ft. of linoleum, and setting up shelves. "Unskilled" work includes tasks such as sweeping, being a supply runner, wiping dust from wood work with oil soap, sorting/moving merchandise and stocking shelves for retail. Work is appropriate for adults or for children 14 and over accompanied by an adult. Power tool use is limited to adults. Work can be scheduled Monday - Friday 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. and Saturday 10:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Evening hours are available based on the needs of the volunteer. We welcome organizations such as Knights of Columbus and will be flexible in scheduling to meet group needs. VATICAN II: DID YOU KNOW?

Pope John XXIII once said, “The idea of a Council did not ripen in me as the fruit of long meditation but came forth like the flower of an unexpected spring.” On July 5, 2013, the Vatican announced that Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II, who both had a profound impact in the Church and the world, will soon be canonized.

+ **Pope Francis’ First Encyclical Letter** *LUMEN FIDEI* (*Light of Faith*) was released to the world on Friday, July 5, 2013. This long expected encyclical on faith was proposed as the last volume in Pope Benedict’s trilogy on the three “theological virtues,” following his encyclicals “Deus Caritas Est” (2005) on charity, and “Spe Salvi” (2007) on hope. “It’s an encyclical written with four hands, so to speak, because Pope Benedict began writing it and he gave it to me,” Pope Francis said.

+ **Catholics, Lutherans Jointly to Mark Reformation Anniversary** Senior Roman Catholic and Lutheran officials announced they would mark the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in 2017 as a shared event rather than highlight the clash that split Western Christianity. The Vatican and the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) presented a report in Geneva admitting both were guilty of harming Christian unity in the past and describing a growing consensus between the two churches in recent decades. + **Dear God, I Don't Get It** The book grapples with the issue of prayer and how God listens and answers or doesn't answer them. The book is written by Patti Maguire Armstrong (Publisher: Liguori). One mother wrote about the effect of the book on her son: “My 11 year old son absolutely LOVED this book. He read this book TWICE in just a few days’ time. In his own words, ‘The book is AWESOME and I LOVE it!’ Shortly after reading the book, my son jumped out of our car at the store to help a lady put her groceries in her car.
