HELP FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED: Do you have a tough time hearing during Mass? Help is here! We have four hearing assistance devices available that are very simple to use. Put an ear bud in one of your ears and you will be hearing the priest, choir, and lectors more clearly. Speak with one of the ushers prior to the beginning of Mass to check out one of these units.

PARKING LOT REMINDERS: Parishioners are reminded that parking spaces on the circular North Fairfield Road driveway on weekends and holy days are for elderly and handicapped individuals who experience distance as a real obstacle to coming to church. For safety reasons, there is no parking along the access road from Fairfield Road to the Bishop Ford Hall, this is a fire lane. Your assistance is appreciated.

CHURCH HANDICAP-ONLY ENTRANCE: The emergency exit near the handicap parking spaces on the school-side of the parking lot is also a handicap-only entrance. An outside entrance-panel is activated and available a half-hour before all weekend Masses begin, and deactivates approximately 5-7 minutes before Mass is scheduled to start. The inside exit-panel is active at all times. Able parishioners are not to use the handicap-only entrance as an alternative door.

GOODBYE SALMA; HELLO TO JERONIMO—Our Newly Sponsored Student: Thanks to your purchases of our Fair Trade and parishioner-made crafts sold by the St. Luke "Created for Giving" group, we have sponsored three young people, enabling them to achieve their educational goals that otherwise would have been unattainable. Elizabeth, from Kenya, is still pursuing a degree, having recently switched career objectives from nursing to teaching. Salma, from Mexico, sponsored in her Senior year of High School, is now retired from the sponsorship program.

Jeronimo, from Guatemala, is our third sponsored student. Jeronimo is 21, the fifth of nine children. His family left Ixil during a period of Civil War and relocated to a piece of land given to them by the government to cultivate crops. The crops yield a family income of about \$60 a month. Jeronimo speaks Spanish, Quiche and Ixil. His dream is to become a professional automobile mechanic. His favorite school subject is Spanish. He likes working in the field, but also lists his favorite pastimes as reading and "studies in the church." His talent is singing. His sponsorship is administered through Christian Foundation for Children and Aging (CFCA), a lay Catholic organization that works with the recipient to allocate the \$30 per month sponsorship in a way that best meets the student's needs. In addition to covering education costs, Jeronimo's sponsorship may provide him and his family with nutrition, health care, clothing and transportation. The St. Luke Social Action Ministry corresponds with the sponsored students, praying for and encouraging them as they progress toward their goals. In turn, they pray for all of us, and we have a place of honor in their homes. The connection is one of mutual respect and affection.

Your support of our monthly Created for Giving sales and patronage at area bazaars has created hope for these sponsored students and their families. If any parishioners have taken a CFCA mission awareness trip to Guatemala or to another country, our St. Luke Social Action Ministry would be interested in learning about your experience. 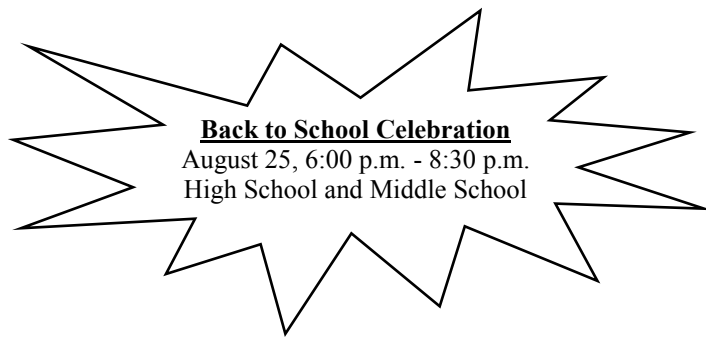

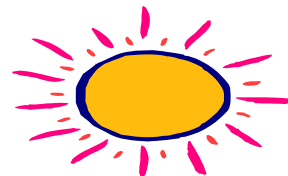

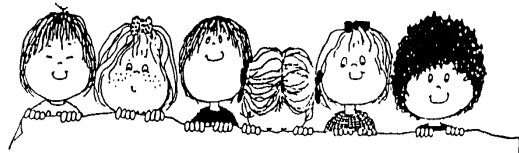
