**MASS COORDINATORS:** If you have a desire to become more involved in the weekend Mass, there are openings available for mass coordinators. We are especially in need of help at the 10:00 a.m. Mass on Sundays. Perhaps you are concerned by what might be required of you if you volunteer. First of all, you have to be a mature 16 year old or older. You will be trained to prepare the wine cups, the bowl of hosts, basic setup of the altar, and making sure the Eucharistic ministers, Lectors and Servers have signed in. If you can pour and count and don't mind assisting people, you are already on your way to being successful. **GLUTEN-FREE HOSTS:** Those with a gluten intolerance who choose to receive a low gluten host for Holy Communion must inform one of the ushers, or a deacon, or else stop by the sacristy near the elevator and inform someone there. This should be done at least 15 minutes before Mass begins. Such hosts require special handling which is why as much advance notice as possible is needed. At that time you will be given instructions on where to lineup to receive the consecrated host at communion time.

**GOODBYE SALMA; HELLO TO JERONIMO—**Our Newly Sponsored Student: Thanks to your purchases of our Fair Trade and parishioner-made crafts sold by the St. Luke “Created for Giving” group, we have sponsored three young people, enabling them to achieve their educational goals that otherwise would have been unattainable. Elizabeth, from Kenya, is still pursuing a degree, having recently switched career objectives from nursing to teaching. Salma, from Mexico, sponsored in her Senior year of High School, is now retired from the sponsorship program.

Jeronimo, from Guatemala, is our third sponsored student. Jeronimo is 21, the fifth of nine children. His family left Ixil during a period of Civil War and relocated to a piece of land given to them by the government to cultivate crops. The crops yield a family income of about \$60 a month. Jeronimo speaks Spanish, Quiche and Ixil. His dream is to become a professional automobile mechanic. His favorite school subject is Spanish. He likes working in the field, but also lists his favorite pastimes as reading and “studies in the church.” His talent is singing. His sponsorship is administered through Christian Foundation for Children and Aging (CFCA), a lay Catholic organization that works with the recipient to allocate the \$30 per month sponsorship in a way that best meets the student's needs. In addition to covering education costs, Jeronimo's sponsorship may provide him and his family with nutrition, health care, clothing and transportation. The St. Luke Social Action Ministry corresponds with the sponsored students, praying for and encouraging them as they progress toward their goals. In turn, they pray for all of us, and we have a place of honor in their homes. The connection is one of mutual respect and affection.

Your support of our monthly Created for Giving sales and patronage at area bazaars has created hope for these sponsored students and their families. If any parishioners have taken a CFCA mission awareness trip to Guatemala or to another country, our St. Luke Social Action Ministry would be interested in learning about your experience. 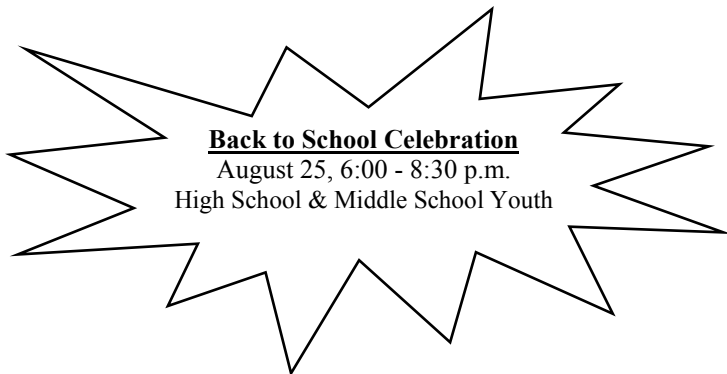

## EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAM

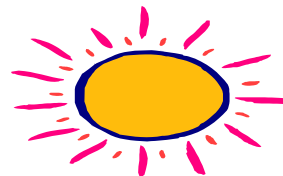

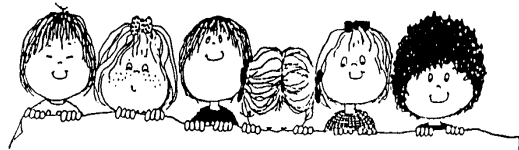


