+ **Remembering John Paul I** Thirty-five years ago (Aug. 25-26) Cardinal Albino Luciani, Patriarch of Venice was elected Pope after the death of Pope Paul VI. Luciani took the name of John Paul I – the first pope to have two names. He wanted to continue the work of Pope Paul VI and Pope John XXIII. His reign lasted for a brief 33 days.
