THERESA FLORES, HUMAN TRAFFICKING SURVIVOR, SPEAKING AT ST. LUKE CHURCH ON TUESDAY OCTOBER 1ST:

St. Luke Church will host the 2013 Distinguished Speaker, Theresa Flores, author of *The Salve Across the Street*. She is a human trafficking survivor who advocates ending trafficking of adolescents in this country. Ms. Flores works with legislators, law enforcement, organizations, and families to prevent and detect trafficking, and to increase opportunities for adolescents already trafficked to escape this slavery. She is a nationally recognized author and presenter. Catholic Social Services of the Miami Valley and the Catholic Social Services Office with the support of Weavers of Justice are organizers of this presentation. A "truck stop" dinner will be served from 5:30 - 6:30 p.m. in the Parish Social Center, desserts and information tables in Kramer Hall throughout the event.
