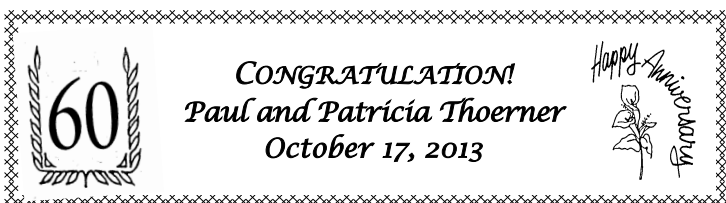

THE BOOK OF NAMES OF THE DEAD

November is the time of harvest and the beginning of the earth's winter sleep. For centuries the Church has observed this month as a special time to pray for our dead. Again this year the parish **Book of Names of the Dead** will be at the Baptismal Font on November 1st. Parishioners are invited to write the names of their deceased family members in the book. This book serves as a reminder and invitation to pray for the dead. At each Mass during the month of November we will pray for those whose names are inscribed in the book. Names of parishioners who were buried from St. Luke Church during the past year have already been placed in the book. You may enter names in the book anytime throughout the month of November.

ALL SOULS EVENING PRAYER

Since the 13th century, Catholics have set apart November 2nd as a day of prayerful remembrance for all the faithful departed. On Sunday, November 3rd, we will celebrate All Souls Day with a special Evening Prayer for the Dead starting at 7:00 p.m. in the Church. We will remember all parishioners who have died in the past year as well as all our beloved dead. Join us as we pray and help us celebrate the promise of resurrection and eternal life, which Christ has given to us.

Decrees are administrative acts of an ecumenical council that apply or interpret articles of canon law. There are nine decrees that came out of Vatican II. The decrees are on the *Church's Missionary Activity (Ad Gentes)*, *Ministry and Life of Priests (Presbyterorum Ordinis)*, *Apostolate of Lay People (Apostolicam Actuositatem)*, *Training of Priests (Optatam Totius)*, *Up-to-Date Renewal of Religious Life (Perfectae Caritatis)*, *Pastoral Office of Bishops in the Church (Christus Dominus)*, *Ecumenism (Unitatis Redintegratio)*, *Catholic Eastern Churches (Orientalium Ecclesiarum)*, and *Means of Social Communication (Inter Mirifica)*.

Currently, the pope's account @Pontifex has 3,051,815 followers.

+ **Blessed John XXIII and Blessed John Paul II to be Canonized** Recognizing that Blessed John XXIII and Blessed John Paul II have widespread reputations for holiness and that years of studying their lives and actions have proven their exceptional virtue, Pope Francis announced he would declare his two predecessors saints at a single ceremony. Pope Francis has decreed that Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II will be raised to Sainthood on April 27, 2014 in Rome, the day on which the Church celebrates the Second Sunday of Easter and Divine Mercy Sunday.
