### VATICAN II: DID YOU KNOW?

Catholic women were not officially invited to the first two sessions of Vatican II. Only at the third session (September 23, 1964) were eight women religious and seven lay women named as council auditors. Twelve additional lay auditors, men and women, were added for the fourth session on September 14, 1965. The named auditors represented Catholic communities, organizations, and countries from around the world. In addition, there were 21 Orthodox and Protestant groups represented at the council.
