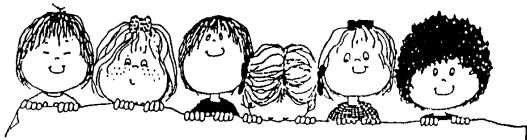


ST. LUKE YOUTH GROUP TAKING ORDERS FOR PIES:
