On Sunday, December 29<sup>th</sup>, at the Angelus prayer, the Holy Father will deliver a special prayer he has composed for the family.

+ **National Migration Week 2014: January 5-11** National Migration Week 2014 will take place January 5-11 with the theme, "Out of the Darkness." Migrants and particularly the most vulnerable migrants: children, the undocumented, refugees, and victims of human trafficking, often find themselves existing in a kind of figurative darkness where their options remain limited and their ability to live out their lives in its fullness severely restricted. 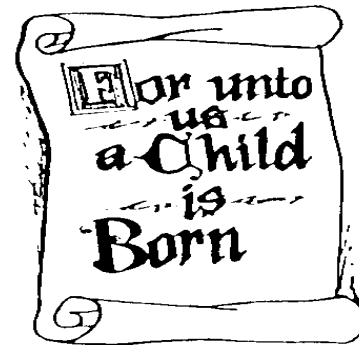
