**APRIL 1<sup>ST</sup> PENANCE SERVICE CANCELLED, 4-EVENINGS OF CONFESSIONS (MARCH 31-APRIL 3) SCHEDULED:** Each evening, 7:00 - 8:00 p.m., Monday (March 31), Tuesday (April 1), Wednesday (April 2) and Thursday (April 3), private confession times have been scheduled in place of the April 1<sup>st</sup> communal reconciliation service. Two priests will be available each evening (Monday through Thursday), giving parishioners 8 hours of confession opportunity. An insufficient number of confessors was available on Tuesday, April 1 for a communal service.

### ☞ LENTEN SEASON ☞

**REGULATION ON LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE:** The Church assigns two public acts of penance during Lent – (1) fasting from food; and (2) abstinence from meat. Both penances are assigned on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting from food - meals for a day equal to no more than one full meal is assigned to everyone between 18 and 59 years of age. Abstaining from meat - Fridays of Lent are assigned to everyone over 14 years of age. A Catholic is obligated to participate in these public penitential days. A person's failure to observe an individual day of public penance is not to be considered serious. A person's failure to observe a substantial number of penitential days, however, is to be considered serious. People are encouraged to do more individual, private acts of penance instead of the minimal days of public acts of penance.

**LENTEN CALENDAR:** Please refer to the Lenten Calendar for information, reminders and schedules of Lenten activities. Activities include: Sunday Evening Vespers, Friday Way of the Cross, a schedule of Lenten and Easter worship and optional weekly almsgiving opportunities. Extra copies are available in Kramer Hall.

**LENTEN FRIDAYS - WAY OF THE CROSS AND LENTEN DINNERS:** Each Friday the Stations of the Cross will be celebrated at 7:00 p.m. in the Church. Various parish groups will lead the Stations. Parishioners are also invited to share a soup-and-bread dinner from 5:30 - 6:45 p.m. or a fish dinner from 5:15 - 6:45 p.m. in the Parish Center. Donations to the soup-and-bread dinner on April 4<sup>th</sup> will go to area charities. The St. Luke's Knights of Columbus will host and serve a family fish dinner on April 11<sup>th</sup>.

**LENTEN SUNDAYS - SUNDAY EVENING VESPERS:** Sundays at 6:30 p.m., in the St. Dominic Chapel, parishioners are invited to pray an ancient prayer of the Church, Evening Prayer, from the *Liturgy of the Hours*. Lay presiders from different parish groups will lead prayers each week.

**NO LENTEN BAPTISMS:** In the ancient tradition of the Church, the season of Lent is a special period for penance, prayer and fasting to: a) prepare the unbaptized for baptism and b) deepen the conversion and renewal of those who are baptized. In keeping this Lenten spirit, Saint Luke will not celebrate baptisms between Ash Wednesday and Easter. Naturally, circumstance, such as the welfare of the child, health of the mother or other serious pastoral reason, may dictate an exception.

**LENTEN WEEKENDS - OPTIONAL LENTEN ALMS OFFERING:** An 'alms offering' is a deed of mercy or a sharing of money, clothes, food, etc., with those who are less fortunate. During Lent, parishioners are invited to participate in an optional weekly alms offering to various groups. The particular offering will be announced in the weekly bulletin and listed on the Lenten Calendar.

**Next weekend, April 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, our Lenten alms offering will be non-perishable food items for the St. Vincent DePaul Food Pantry.** Please consider adding the following items to your donation: tuna, canned soup, peanut butter, breakfast cereal, toothpaste, toilet paper, tissues, bath soap and laundry detergent.

+ **RCIA Scrutinies** are rites for the unbaptized and take place on the Third (5:30 p.m. Mass), Fourth (8:00 a.m. Mass), and Fifth Sundays (noon Mass) of Lent. "The Scrutinies lead the Elect into a deeper quest for healing, purification, and enlightenment. In keeping with the Lenten themes, this time is a period of more intense spiritual preparation, consisting more in interior reflection than in catechetical instruction, and is intended to purify the minds and hearts of the elect as they search their own consciences and do penance. This period is intended as well to enlighten the minds and hearts of the elect with a deeper knowledge of Christ the Savior." The Elect and the Candidates will all be exploring the 10 Commandments, the Beatitudes, Catholic Morality, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please remember them in your daily prayers.
