## ☞ LENTEN SEASON ☞

### REGULATION ON LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE:

The Church assigns two public acts of penance during Lent – (1) fasting from food; and (2) abstinence from meat. Both penances are assigned on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting from food – meals for a day equal to no more than one full meal is assigned to everyone between 18 and 59 years of age. Abstaining from meat – Fridays of Lent are assigned to everyone over 14 years of age. A Catholic is obligated to participate in these public penitential days. A person's failure to observe an individual day of public penance is not to be considered serious. A person's failure to observe a substantial number of penitential days, however, is to be considered serious. People are encouraged to do more individual, private acts of penance instead of the minimal days of public acts of penance.

Activities include: Sunday Evening Vespers, Friday Way of the Cross, a schedule of Lenten and Easter worship and optional weekly almsgiving opportunities. Extra copies are available in Kramer Hall.

**LENTEN FRIDAYS - WAY OF THE CROSS:** On Friday the Stations of the Cross will be celebrated at 7:00 p.m. in the Church.

**LENTEN SUNDAYS - SUNDAY EVENING VESPERS:** Sunday at 6:30 p.m., in the St. Dominic Chapel, parishioners are invited to pray an ancient prayer of the Church, Evening Prayer, from the *Liturgy of the Hours*.

**ENCORE LENTEN FAMILY FISH DINNER:** The Beavercreek Knights of Columbus (Rev J. **LENTEN WEEKENDS - OPTIONAL LENTEN ALMS OFFERING:** An 'alms offering' is a deed of mercy or a sharing of money, clothes, food, etc., with those who are less fortunate. During Lent, parishioners are invited to participate in an optional weekly alms offering to various groups. **Next weekend, April 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>, our Lenten almsgiving will be for the Family Violence Prevention Center of Greene County.**

Items donated will be used to make up kits. **Home Starter Kits** for those in transition to new apartments include brooms, dustpans, dish and paper towels, pot scrubbers, sponges, trash cans and bags, rubber/latex gloves, buckets, cleaning supplies such as glass cleaners, disinfectants, kitchen cleanser, and dish detergent. Items are requested to be new and unopened. **Hygiene Kits** include soap, shampoo, lotion, toothbrushes and toothpaste. **Baby Hygiene Kits** contain receiving blankets, diapers and pins, soap, baby socks, undershirts and play sets, bottles and formula.

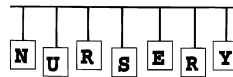
