ST. LUKE SVDP CONFERENCE QUARTERLY REPORT: Your St. Luke SVdP Conference thanks you very much for your continued generosity toward helping families during hard times. From January 1 to March 31, 2014 you enabled us to help 44 families with utility bills (DP&L, Vectren, Water); 13 families with rent and 1 family with a mortgage payment; 12 Handipaks; gasoline card for 3 families and car payments for 3 families; food card for 1 family; prescription for 1 family; and our monthly support for: a SVdP conference in Bolivia, 1 SVdP conference in Greene County and 1 conference in Montgomery County, the DePaul Center, SVdP Safe Haven, the SVdP Pantry through donations from parishioners, and money for Bingo at 3 area nursing homes. We referred 50 out of area callers to other SVdP Conferences and to other help agencies. The total amount of expenditures was \$18,684.05. Giovanni Battista Montini was born on 26th September 1897 in Concesio, Italy, and died on 6 August 1978 in Castel Gandolfo. Pope Francis will beatify Pope Paul VI during the closing Mass of the extraordinary Synod of Bishops on the family.

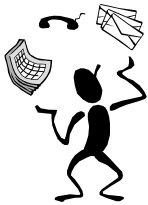
