+ **Pope Francis: Professing The Faith Without Good Works Is Just Spouting Hot Air** Understanding God's commandments and church doctrine is useless if those truths aren't put into practice, Pope Francis said. "A faith without bearing fruit in life, a faith that doesn't bear fruit in works is not faith," the pope said in a Mass homily [see Book of James 2:14-24]. Professing the faith without giving a witness makes the Gospel "words and nothing more than words," he said. "You may know all the commandments, all the prophecies, all the truths of the faith, but if this isn't put into practice, is not translated into works, it serves nothing." "Having faith isn't having knowledge," the pope said. Instead, it is "receiving God's message" as brought by Christ. There can be people who know very little or nothing about doctrine, "but have lots of faith" because rather than embracing "abstract truths," they embrace the living Christ, the pope said.

+ **Startled By God: Wisdom from Unexpected Places** by Joe McHugh with foreword by Michael Joncas (Franciscan Media) looks at contemplative practice in today's secular culture. The author is a great storyteller and uses stories to show us about our search for the living God in the hidden and mundane workings of our daily living.
