THE LENTEN SEASON

FAST AND ABSTINENCE

REGULATION ON LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE:

The Church assigns two public acts of penance during Lent – (1) fasting from food; and (2) abstinence from meat. Both penances are assigned on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting from food - one meal a day and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity is traditionally assigned to everyone between 18 and 59 years of age. Abstaining from meat - Fridays of Lent are traditionally assigned to everyone over 14 years of age. A Catholic is obligated to participate in these public penitential days. The Holy Father has taught that a person's failure to observe an individual day of public penance is not to be considered serious. A person's failure to observe a substantial number of penitential days is to be considered serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard. Instead, people should consider doing more individual, private acts of penance instead of the minimal days of public acts of penance.

LENTEN SUNDAY EVENING VESPERS: Beginning at 6:30 p.m. in St. Dominic Chapel, parishioners are invited to pray an ancient prayer of the Church, Evening Prayer, from the *Liturgy of the Hours*.

LENTEN CALENDAR: Parishioners are invited to refer to the Lenten Calendar for information and schedule of Lenten activities. The calendar points to the schedule of Holy Week and Easter worship. Extra copies are available in Kramer Hall.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: Divine Mercy Sunday occurs on April 12th. It is a feast day specifically requested by Jesus in his revelations to St. Faustina. We will celebrate the Feast with a Divine Mercy Program beginning at 2:30 in the afternoon. The service will include Benediction, the recitation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Scripture reading, period of meditation and close with the recitation of the Rosary. Immediately following the service we will have refreshments and a video presentation on St. Faustina in Kramer Hall. Please mark this date on your calendar and plan on attending.

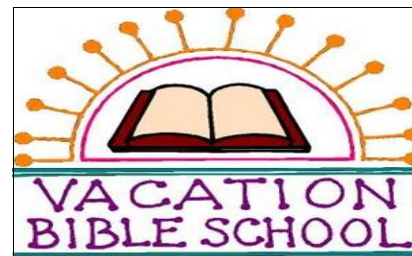
CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

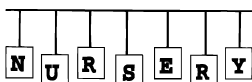
