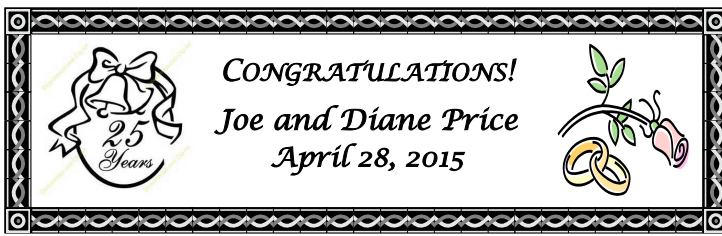

SCHOOL HAPPENINGS: Following is what has been happening in the month of March/April at St. Luke School.

Junior High Reading: 7th and 8th grade Reading classes studied poetry. They learned to identify the meter (iambic, trochaic, anapestic, dactylic, pyrrhic, dimeter, trimeter, tetrameter, pentameter, etc.) and style of poems (limerick, haiku, lyric, narrative, ballad, epic, sonnet). Students will next be analyzing poetry, researching poets and writing poems of their own.

Junior High Science: 8th Grade students completed a unit about acids and bases-pH scale, testing household items and PHET inquiry lab- exploring acids in solutions. They then moved on to a unit on waves, which will explore properties and characteristics of all types of waves. The electromagnetic spectrum will be explored and quantum theory will be introduced.

7th Grade science students followed current volcano eruptions. They then began a unit on geological time, fossils, animal adaptations, and relative and absolute dating, which included a radioactive dating lab.

ST. LUKE LEISURE CLUB TRIP TO SAN ANTONIO, TX: Like to travel! Let's all head to San Antonio with the St. Luke Leisure Club for an exciting 9-day, 8-night excursion.
