THE LENTEN SEASON

REGULATION ON LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE: The Church assigns two public acts of penance during Lent – (1) fasting from food; and (2) abstinence from meat. Both penances are assigned on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting from food - one meal a day and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity is traditionally assigned to everyone between 18 and 59 years of age. Abstaining from meat - Fridays of Lent are traditionally assigned to everyone over 14 years of age. A Catholic is obligated to participate in these public penitential days. The Holy Father has taught that a person's failure to observe an individual day of public penance is not to be considered serious. A person's failure to observe a substantial number of penitential days is to be considered serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; people should consider doing more individual, private acts of penance instead of the minimum days of public penance.

LENTEN WEEKENDS - OPTIONAL ALMS GIVING: During Lent, parishioners are invited to participate in an optional weekly alms offering to various groups.

Next weekend, March 19th and 20th, our Lenten alms giving will be a new and gently used household goods collection for Catholic Social Services Miami Valley (CSSMV)--Refugee Resettlement. Recently CSSMV's highest need has been for kitchen items, especially stock pots. Plates, bowls, 12-oz cups, silverware, sauce pans, frying pans and utensils are highly requested. Linens most needed are towels and washcloths, full or twin size sheet sets, blankets, comforters, and new pillows. CSSMV has recently added Dayton Public School uniform wear, size 12 and under, to their most needed list. Specific needs are polo shirts in white, navy, burgundy or red, and navy or khaki pants. A small logo on the clothing is okay. Donations can be brought to Kramer Hall. LENTEN SUNDAYS - SUNDAY EVENING VESPERS will be held on Sundays at 6:30 p.m. in St. Dominic Chapel. Parishioners are invited to pray an ancient prayer of the Church, Evening Prayer, from the *Liturgy of the Hours*. Lay presiders from different parish groups will lead prayers each Sunday through Palm Sunday.

LENTEN CALENDAR: Parishioners are invited to refer to the Lenten Calendar for information, reminders and schedules of activities. The calendar points to special prayer possibilities including Sunday Evening Vespers and Friday Way of the Cross.

NO LENTEN BAPTISMS: The season of Lent is a special period for penance, prayer and fasting to: a) prepare the unbaptized for baptism and b) deepen the conversion and renewal of those who are baptized. In keeping with this Lenten spirit, Saint Luke will not celebrate baptisms between Ash Wednesday and Easter. Naturally, circumstance, such as the welfare of the child, health of the mother or other serious pastoral reason may dictate an exception.

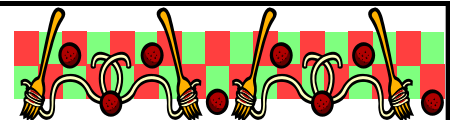
