## THE LENTEN SEASON



### Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion – March 20, 2016

**Processions define this Holy Week.** We bless palms then we process into church after hearing the same chorus sung by angels over the manger: “Peace on earth and glory in the highest.” On Holy Thursday, we process to the Meal of the Lord and then, later, to the place of repose to ponder and give thanks. On Good Friday, we process to the Cross to behold, genuflect, and embrace. In the holy night of Easter, we follow in procession the Light, our dead and risen Christ. We process to the font and wash clean new disciples who will take up with us the great mercy works: feeding, sheltering, clothing, visiting, burying, and giving, giving, giving. Like our ancestors of Exodus, we process to our promised home behaving as if we are there. To whom will I go?

**GOOD FRIDAY COLLETION:** On Good Friday, our parish is called on to support Christians in the Holy Land. As a pontifical collection requested by Pope Francis, we join with Catholics around the world to stand in solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land. You become an instrument of peace in a troubled land with your contribution. In these challenging times in the Middle East, your support means our church will conduct parish ministry, provide Catholic education, feed the hungry, build housing for Christians, maintain shrines and operate refugee centers in the Holy Land. Christians, along with all of the clergy and religious who serve in the Holy Land, will deeply appreciate your prayers and financial help! Like Simon of Cyrene, you can help carry the cross under very difficult circumstances in the Holy Land.

**REGULATION ON LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE:** The Church assigns two public acts of penance during Lent – (1) fasting from food; and (2) abstinence from meat. Both penances are assigned on Good Friday. Fasting from food - one meal a day and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity is traditionally assigned to everyone between 18 and 59 years of age. Abstaining from meat - Fridays of Lent are assigned to everyone over 14 years of age. A Catholic is obligated to participate in these public penitential days.

**LENTEN SUNDAY EVENING VESPERS** will be held on Sundays at 6:30 p.m. in St. Dominic Chapel. Parishioners are invited to pray an ancient prayer of the Church, Evening Prayer, from the *Liturgy of the Hours*. Lay presiders from different parish groups will lead prayers each Sunday through Palm Sunday.

**DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY:** Divine Mercy Sunday occurs on April 3<sup>rd</sup>. It is a feast day specifically requested by Jesus in his revelations to St. Faustina. We will celebrate with a Divine Mercy Program beginning at 2:55 p.m. The service will include Benediction, the recitation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, scripture reading, period of meditation and close with the recitation of the Rosary. The prayer service will be followed at 4:00 p.m. with refreshments and a video presentation in Kramer Hall focusing on Divine Mercy All are welcome as we celebrate this very special day selected by Jesus.

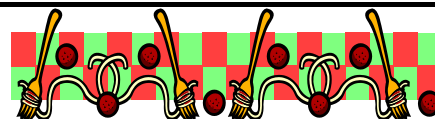
