KNOW MERCY SHOW MERCY

Second Sunday in Easter Time – April 3, 2016

We cannot hide. No out-of-the-way room, no locked door keeps the Risen Christ away from us. He finds the way to us day after day. We recognize him, both in his repeated Easter greeting (“Peace be with you.”) and in his badges beyond death (resurrected wounds in hands and side). We recognize him in bread and wine transformed. We recognize him in those who gather with us – those near, those across the room, those in between. Jesus is seen on Sunday. And we are seen by him, with him, in him. Like Doubting-to-Believing Thomas, we put our fingers and hands on him. And like the disciples, he breathes on us mercy and forgiveness.

- Who needs mercy and forgiveness this week?
- Who needs **my** merciful forgiveness? Perhaps it is someone I love. Perhaps it is someone I don’t.

Jesus spoke to St. Faustina—“...Before I come as a just judge, I first open wide the door of My mercy. He who refuses to pass through the door of My mercy must pass through the door of My justice.” Come and join in celebrating **Divine Mercy Sunday on April 3rd**. Our hour long prayer service begins at 2:55 p.m. with Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament. FOLLOWING IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF SR. DOROTHY STANG, SNDdeN: Join with volunteers from various faith communities in planting seedlings at Great Miami Wetland Mitigation Bank, Five Rivers Metropark, 2773 N. Snyder Road in Dayton (south of Trotwood), on Saturday April 9th, 8:45 - 12:00 noon, rain or shine. Prayer begins at 8:45 a.m. This memorial event pays tribute to Sr. Dorothy Stang, who gave her life while championing the rights of poor land owners in Anapu, Brazil. Sr. Dorothy and her fellow sisters taught the people of the Amazon sustainability and reforestation of their lands that were illegally burned by wealthy ranchers and loggers.

This faith-in-action event allows us to respond to the call of Pope Francis for people of all faiths to care for creation. We work in solidarity with “Dorothy's people” in Anapu, Brazil, who care for their lands by planting trees and by sustainable use of the land. We restore our own natural areas which have been diminished by the Emerald Ash Borer beetle and other invasive species, and by human impacts. Restoring our native biodiversity and ecosystems results in improved health for our environment and for ourselves.

Join us in this annual memorial to remember the sacrifices of our native Dayton sister and to learn more about this unique natural area, the first wetland mitigation bank in southwestern Ohio.
