Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time – June 12, 2016

SUMMER CHANGE IN TUESDAY'S EXPOSITION AND ADORATION: Tuesday's 8:30 a.m. morning Mass will move from the main church to St. Dominic's Chapel, and Mass and Eucharistic Adoration will take place in the same location. Without the Mass and Adoration location change that occurs during the school year, the Eucharist is properly exposed for Adoration right before the end of Mass. While a communal recitation of the rosary is typically prayed between location changes during the school year, the rosary will not be communally prayed with the immediate beginning of Adoration in Saint Dominic's Chapel. As a prayer of petition addressed to the Blessed Mother, and not to Christ exposed for Adoration, the rosary is appropriately precluded from recitation to focus attention on the Lord and devotion to the Eucharistic mystery.

Communal Rosary 8:00 a.m. before Tuesday 8:30 Mass: Continuing until the start of the new school year, the Rosary will be prayed before Mass, beginning at 8:00 a.m. and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will occur immediately after Mass.
