Each year, about 1.6 million juniors in more than 22,000 high schools enter the National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT[®]), which serves as an initial screen of program entrants. The nationwide pool of 16,000 semifinalists, representing less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors, includes the highest scoring entrants in each state.

Michael is currently a senior at Chaminade Julianne and plans to attend college and pursue a career in computer software development.
