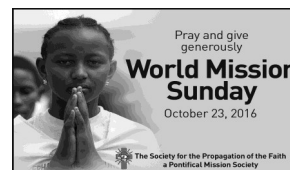


Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time – October 23, 2016

Who am I kidding? If I would do all the right things for the wrong reasons, would they still count? Probably not. Would God care? Most likely, yes! The Gospel paints this picture. The boasting person at prayer: I fast, I pray, I tithe, I am faithful – I am not like “him”....(and everyone sees this about me). But the humble one prays: I am far from perfect, I sin – be full of mercy. The Old Testament reading sheds more light. Be like God, Sirach says. Attend to the poor, the widow, the orphan (anyone in need), God says. Look to them. Care for them. It is right and just behavior.

- How will I boast, not in myself, but in the Lord?
- How will I behave? Whom will I help?

THE BOOK OF NAMES OF THE DEAD

November is the time of harvest and the beginning of the earth's winter sleep. For centuries the Church has observed this month as a special time to pray for our dead. Again this year the parish **Book of Names of the Dead** will be at the Baptismal Font on November 1st. Parishioners are invited to write the names of their deceased family members in the book. This book serves as a reminder and invitation to pray for the dead. At each Mass during the month of November we will pray for those whose names are inscribed in the book. Names of parishioners who were buried from St. Luke Church during the past year have already been placed in the book. You may enter names in the book anytime throughout the month of November.

ALL SOULS EVENING PRAYER

Since the 13th century, Catholics have set apart November 2nd as a day of prayerful remembrance for all the faithful departed. On Wednesday, November 2nd, we will celebrate All Souls Day with a special Evening Prayer for the Dead starting at 7:00 p.m. in the Church.
