The essay is to be 500-750 words in length. Pages should be typed or neatly handwritten in ink and stapled. Spelling and grammar count!

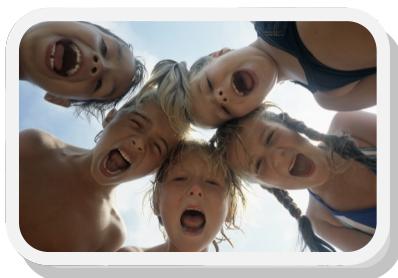
